MEDIATIZATION




- mediation of the media in getting to know the world by their recipients
- media = "window to the world"
- agenda setting
- lack of direct cognition

POLITICAL COMMUNICATION

- *purposeful communication about politics*
- it incorporates . . . communication about these actors and their activities, as contained in news reports, editorials, and other forms of media discussion of politics




adaptation of mass media logic by political actors and mediainduced changes in the public representation of politics (Michael Meyen)

INFOTAINMENT

information + entertainment

 mixing public and private life, using a sensational style, a sometimes skeptical but always populist tone and blurring the line between documentary and fiction, between news and entertainment (Wiesław Godzic)



POLITAINMENT



- politics and entertainment
- blurring the line between serious and trivial activities
- soft kind of

CELEBRITY

- Known (Famous) for being Famous
- celebrity: people who a greater presence and wider scope of activity and agency than are those who make up the rest of the population. They are allowed to move on the public stage while the rest of us watch
- stardom and celebritism

- John Street: employing of the methods aimed at gaining popularity by politicians

CELEBRITIZATION OF POLITICS


strategies:

CELEBRITIZATION OF POLITICS





complicated relations between politics and popular culture: –opposition (critique of government) –coexistence (symbiosis)

- personnel interpenetration
- popular culture's traditional role: critical evaluation of political power






CELEBRITY POLITICIANS

- Labour Party Leader (1994-2007)




TONY BLAIR IN POPULAR CULTURE

THE GHOST

- Robert Harris
- 2007
- 2010 (*Ghostwriter* movie by Roman Polański)
- novel's author = disappointed Blair's supporter
- impetus war in Iraq



THE GHOST

- Ghost unknown writing various kinds of books on demand
- Adam Lang books version of Tony Blair; using Ghost's expertize to write memoirs

THE GHOST

BLAIR/LANG

- PM as political celebrity:
 - young Lang was an actor
 - politics is game
- acting along the United States interests (Rycart)
- PM's wife

I'll give you anything you ask for - as long as it's not something I don't want to give


US President: Very satisfactory indeed. We got what we came for, and our special relationship is still very special.






- 24 June 1963

- hit: Skóra






PAWEŁ KUKIZ PIERSI


